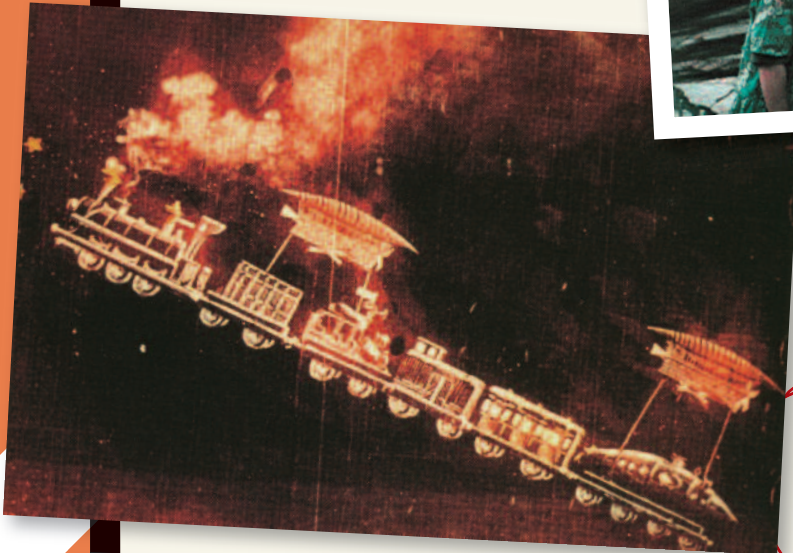
Activity: Dizzy Days

THINK about your local area: where do you like to go? What do you enjoy doing? Why do you like these things? Are there things you'd like to do but can't? Are there things you don't like about your local area? Make a mind map of your ideas.

MAKE notes about how these ideas could be represented by a series of photos or by making a short film using your phone, eg if you love hanging out with mates at the park then take some shots of someone on a swing from interesting angles, if you love walking on the hills take a wide-angle photo of the view from the top.

THINK about what and who you want in the photos or film. Where do you want to take them? They can be realistic or abstract.

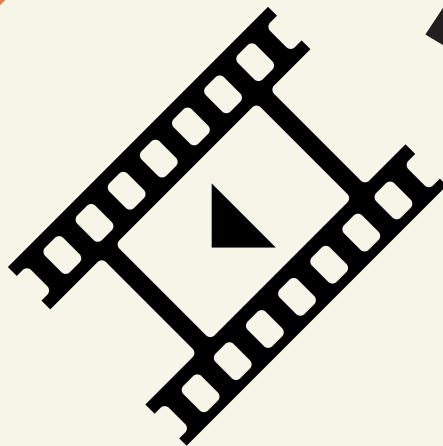


YOU CAN PLAY WITH:
