

The Royal Pavilion is one of Britain's most eccentric and extravagant palaces previously occupied by three monarchs. George IV. William IV and Queen Victoria. Built as George IV's pleasure palace, it has been restored to its original 1823 splendour with Indian architecture contrasted with interiors inspired by China.

October-March: 10am-5.15pm (last entrance at 4.30pm, last group tour 4pm).

April-September: 9.30am-5.45pm (last entrance at 5pm. last group tour 4.30pm).

Closed: 25 and 26 December and from 2.30pm on 24 December.
